**PASTOR'S REPORT:** March has been a month of doctor appointments and work trying to get my brain back! Physical therapy and Speech therapy is helping but I feel like I'm not quite *all there* yet. March 30<sup>th</sup> rehab amounted to another trip to ER. Another symptom arose that caused them to insist I go. So, another CT scan and blood work to make sure I wasn't stroking out. The blood work showed very low sodium. They never did tell me where it went! I was still able to come for the Good Friday service at the Methodist Church.

Much of the month I worked from home. Ciara and I have gotten good at relaying the work back and forth. She and her family have been sick as well. So we have been a couple of people with diminished faculties. But we got the jobs done.

I was happy to be able to attend the special event of Jews for Jesus. I am so grateful to Crystal and Kathy for helping to get the publicity out there and set-up. On top of that, Crystal and Darrel were gracious enough to host David Garrett. I believe the people who attended saw the Passover in a new light and could better understand what Jesus was doing that last night in the Upper Room. David did a great job of presentation. We continue to pray for him and his group as they leave for Israel in two weeks. There they will join with other Jews for Jesus missionaries to evangelize among the Jewish and other ethnic people in Israel. In many places there are communities where faith in Christ is forbidden. A dangerous place indeed.

It was a joy to see the children's program on Palm Sunday. They always make our service so special not to mention the sugar highs after collecting the eggs.

Thank you everyone for your patience with me as I work to heal. This has been the weirdest journey I have ever taken. I believe I am making good progress. I've been told that one day, all of a sudden, everything will just click I can't wait for all my circuits to be connected again.

There were a couple changes to the Ministry Team members with Lyndsey Johnson leaving the Personnel Team and becoming part of the Worship Team. Tammy Duley is going off Worship but will continue on her other 3 Teams.

Kathy reported that a new water heater was installed in the manse.
