THE BURNING BUSH

My self-assigned task for this month (and the next four) is to write about each of the developmental tasks we will work on during my time with you. This month I will try to shed light on:

1. Come to Terms with History.

In "normal" times, the departure of a pastor or the circumstances surrounding the departure need to be grieved. Part of the "history sharing" is recognition of that grief and may include any unresolved grief around any previous pastoral departures. But we have come through a pandemic and grief is all around us, especially in this congregation. So many have lost loved ones and friends in the last few years. Our church life and personal lives were substantially altered, and some things may never be the way they used to be. Any new circumstances for grieving may cause the grief process to be heightened as other losses (recent and old) come flooding back into our hearts. Through the grief sermon series, regular conversations, sharing of our concerns in prayer, and home visits, our congregation has multiple ways that we have supported one another in our common grief. This is work that we will continue to address in these healthy ways.

Additionally, we come to terms with history by recognizing the work of church members in the development of programs and ministry. This congregation regularly takes responsibility of taking charge of the direction and work of the church. We need to tell the great stories of the church and encourage members to hear each other's stories as they relate to God's great story of creation and recreation.

Finally, as a part of the Mission Study process we may review (or create, if needed) a timeline of the significant events and ministries of the church through its inception to now. Reviewing a timeline and seeing patterns or unique moments almost always inspires new thoughts about our current life together and possibilities of what God may be calling us to do and be next.

Snippets from the April 13 Session Meeting:

Financial Reports/Discussions: Kathy was in attendance and went over the financial reports. She answered the questions presented. She then went over the Trustees Report that she had written/presented.

REPORTS:

- CLERKS REPORT:
- Correspondence: Thank you from Spoon River Valley School's principal for all the coats and accessories from the Coat Closet. She stated that the items were very much needed/appreciated.
- Email/Text Approvals:
 - On March 20, an email was received requesting the use of the CE Building on Saturday, April 22 from 1-3pm. There will be a baby shower for Bonnie Suydam's newest Grandson, Reed hosted by Jenny Suydam. This was approved.
 - On March 21, an email was received requesting a vacation week for Pastor Cindy. This would be from Sunday, April 16 through Saturday, April 22. This was approved.
 - On March 21, an email was received requesting that Dean Warner be approved to fill the pulpit on Sunday, April 16. Pastor Cindy will be on vacation. This was approved.
 - On March 24 an email was sent from Brady asking for approval of the Video Upgrade (not to exceed \$450) for the new TVs and Audio Upgrades (not to exceed \$7,500) which will include the purchase of new mics, for use during kid's programs and other events. Audio Upgrade to include 3 lapel microphones, 2 Pulpit microphones and 2 wireless handheld microphones. 3 microphones will also be installed above the TVs for better sound pickup in the sanctuary. Six Elders responded with their approval votes.

NEW MEMBER: Ben Arnold desires to become a member of the congregation via reaffirmation of faith. He told the story of his faith journey. He will be a welcome addition to our congregation. The Session voted to approve his desire to become a member of First Presbyterian and will be received on April 23, Sunday. Pastor Cindy offered a prayer. At this point, Ben was given the chance to either leave or stay for the rest of the meeting. He chose to stay.

MINISTRY TEAM REPORTS

- Worship Team Alissa (chair), Beth, Brady, Sam Sprecher, Diana Rolando & Jane Rutledge.
 - Beth reported that both pianos, one in CE Building and one in Sanctuary, needed tuning.
 Clark Evans had tuned one of them and within a couple weeks it was again out of tune. The

Session voted to approve the tuning of both pianos. It was approved to spend up to \$500, but if more, to come back to Session for further action.

- Beth relayed information from Diana that the organ also needs repairs. The lower keyboard does not work as well as other problems. The Session voted to approve the organ be repaired. It was approved to spend up to \$1,000, but if more, to come back to Session for further action.
- The music Committee will take care of getting this work done.

• Christian Education Team – Bonnie (chair) & Alissa

- Dates herein are approved by consensus.
- <u>Review Curriculum</u> for the Confirmation Class.
- <u>Sunday School Curriculum</u>: The teachers for Sunday School will be offered the chance to try other study materials for their fall classes, if they so choose. The upper grades would like to switch from the David Cook Series.
- <u>Fall Sunday School:</u> Sunday School will resume September 10, Sunday, with a pancake breakfast.
- Last day of Sunday School is May 21, 2023. It was decided to have regular class but break early so the kids can enjoy a Sundae Bar. Bonnie and Lissy will take care of getting the ice cream and different toppings. This will also be used for Fellowship.
- <u>VBS</u>: A committee of Bonnie, Alissa, Crystal, Missy and Pastor Cindy met to discuss VBS. It was decided to hold VBS on Sunday, July 9 through Thursday, July 13.
 - Safety The current Safety Policy in place will work for VBS. The sign-up sheet will include a section for any special things a kid might need (i.e., food allergies). Bonnie also thought it would be good to have someone in charge of watching for any security problems during each session.
 - There was a question of whether background checks will be needed, Kathy Welch is going to be asked to check with Church insurer to see what, if anything, is needed.
- <u>FOOD</u>: The committee decided that there should be no meals served and maybe even having prepared individual snacks purchased. In that way, no County Food Permit would be required. After some discussion, Bonnie said she would bring this back to committee.
- <u>New ideas:</u>
 - Will work on the idea of having mailings before VBS and find out if address labels can be loaded into church computer. Steffanie might be able to help with this question.
 - Will move furniture from Sunday School Rooms with help from congregation on Sunday 5/21/23.
 - Clean up sanctuary and CE building will be done the Sunday after VBS. A date will be set up for a Crew to organize and put away VBS materials in the storage room.
- <u>Clean out:</u> Sunday School rooms need to be de-cluttered. Before VBS, the Preschool and High School rooms will be cleaned. Before next Fall, clean out 1st – 3rd rooms. Need to get the TV's removed.

- <u>New TVs:</u> The Session voted to approve the purchase of 32" smart TVs for Sunday School rooms. Bonnie will get back to Session with the number of TVs wanted.
- <u>3rd grade Bibles</u>. Will be needed for Gianna Perardi and Nolan Ulm.
- <u>Teacher recognition</u>, Gifts will be provided for SS Teachers. Bonnie will find out what the overall budget is for Sunday School needs.

 - Finance
 - The 4th of July Picnic in the Park is going to be held. Ryan will let the City Chamber of Commerce know that. It was decided to use the money earned from the Soup Supper to help with costs for the needed supplies for this event.

 - Palm Sunday Potluck was a success with many enjoying the Fellowship and the kids enjoyed the Egg Hunt.
 - Jodi stated that we will have a bazaar and walking tacos during Spoon River Drive. She said that the plan is to sell out of the Church kitchen. More info in the future.

 - The Community Soup Supper on Saturday, March 25, was a great success with a profit of \$1,093 realized. Good time had by all those in the kitchen.
 - On Sunday, June 11, Jodi wants to try a food/fellowship evening. She proposed listening to a Bible Pod Cast and then discussing it. More info to come but mark your calendar now. This sounds like fun and something different. Let's all give it a try.
 - Jodi also wants the Church to get involved in the Christmas Walk this year. More info to come.

 - Brady reported that the Wi-Fi Upgrade Project is now complete.
 - The Video & Sound Project will be complete before the end of the month. An additional lapel mic was added to the project, since the one used for worship has quit working.

Food Pantry

The Farmington Food Pantry is open on the 3rd Wednesday of each month from 12:30pm – 1:30 pm. The Food Pantry is located at New Hope Fellowship Church 1102 N. State Route 78, Farmington, IL 61531. You do not even need to get out of your car. It is open to anyone in the Farmington area school district or who lives in Elmwood. There is no income requirement. You can now follow the Food Pantry on Facebook at Farmington IL Food Pantry.

Little Free Pantry

On the east side of the CE building, just south of the door, is a Little Free Pantry that the local Girl Scouts put together. This little free pantry is open and free for anyone, anytime. Feel free to drop off any food to help keep it stocked. Also, feel free to take any food that you might need, no questions asked. This food pantry supports those in our community who might need some extra food on those days when the Food Pantry is closed.

Per Capita 2023

The Per Capita amount for each member for 2023 is \$36.25. This is not an assessment or dues, but a covenant relationship with the greater church. This amount is not in our 2023 budget but paid as collected from each member to the Presbytery of Great Rivers.
