2. Discovering a new identity – Clarifying and restating the mission of the church

According to Barry W. These are just a few of questions we need to ask and answer as we seek to discern what God is calling us to do in the name of Jesus Christ as we are empowered by the Holy Spirit. I hope you are excited to have these conversations in the days and weeks ahead. I pray that some of you may experience the call to serve on the mission study group!

Snippets from the May 11 Session Meeting.

**Financial Reports/Discussions:** Kathy was in attendance and went over the financial reports. She answered the questions presented.

She then went over the Trustees Report that she had written/presented. She presented a quote from Otto Baum Co., Inc. for exterior masonry repairs to lower east window of Church Building. This will include equipment and materials for job and installing temporary shoring as needed for safety. Remove existing wood lintel above window and install two new galvanized steel lintels. This work includes removing rowlock course of brick above the existing wood lintel for the thickness of the wall, removing existing wood lintel, installing new lintels with membrane flashing, stainless steel termination bar and drip edge over outer-wythe lintel and the brick above new lintel. relaying new brick above the lintel and installing new weeps every 16" O.C. in outer-wythe. Then clean up and remove equipment and debris. The bid was presented, and the Session voted to approve.

Kathy also mentioned that there is another big project in the works. When the organ was being repaired, it was found to have plaster dust in the workings. This means that the room that houses the pipes and other organ parts is causing the dust problem. The plaster ceiling of the room is flaking off and getting into the organ workings. The Trustees are working on this and will have more information in the near future.

## o <u>Technology Team</u> – Brady (chair) & Ryan

- 1. The Audio and Video upgrades have been completed. The Audio works fantastic both in the Sanctuary and Live Stream. Thanks to Tadd for getting us all the right equipment to make the audio side sound so much better.
- 2. The Hearing Assist device is currently not connected to the sound system along with the CE Building speakers. During the upgrade, the CE Building speakers could not give a clean sound without being really "crackly". They have been disconnected at the sound system side.
- 3. The Sanctuary computer Memory has been upgraded as a "band-aid" for the computer to be able to run the Media Shout program and provide the output to the new TVs. (See Discussion Item #2, 3 and 4.)

#### **Discussion Items:**

- 1. Need to discuss replacing/upgrading the Hearing Assist Device: The last device was purchased around 7/3/2003. The device has had minimal usage since May 2016. The Session decided to not spend any money on this item.
- 2. Sanctuary Desktop needs to be upgraded. The plan is to get a "Custom-built" PC that will be designed to handle the Media Shout program efficiently. After the Sanctuary PC is upgraded, then the Old Sanctuary PC will be moved into the church office to be used as a "Secretary" computer. We may need to purchase a monitor for that spot. Then the plan is to move the "Secretary" Laptop to the Sunday school rooms for them to use for various videos and the programs that they have in the sanctuary. The Sanctuary Desktop that is being moved to the Church Office would need to have Microsoft Office installed on it, if the move is approved. The Sanctuary computer does not have Office on it. The current version for "Home & Student" is \$149.99 from BestBuy. (Word, Excel, & PowerPoint). If we have enough

activation keys/can find them, then Office won't need to be purchased. The other option is to remove Office from the laptop and install it on the desktop.
