THE BURNING BUSH

As I write this newsletter article, I am keenly aware of dying and death. We have a member and we have loved ones who are in the dying process. WAIT – this is the DECEMBER newsletter article. Why aren't you writing an article about Christmas, Pastor Cindy?!

I have a friend, a fellow Presbyterian minister, that I met in August of 1988 as we both moved into a dormitory on the campus of Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary. Little did we know that our future husbands also moved into the dorm that same day. Neither of us came to seminary expecting to marry someone – it really was the furthest thing from our minds – Truly.

October of 1989, I drove to Pittsburgh to be in Cathy and Jon's wedding, and she was in my Louisville wedding to Kerry in August of 1990. Off and on throughout our 35 years in ministry, we have kept in touch with each other. As the pandemic began, we realized that we needed to reconnect regularly with each other and our three other closest female friends from seminary. We were all feeling isolated, overwhelmed, and burned out. Little did we know how important that reconnection would become.

Shortly after we reconnected, Jon began to suffer from very serious health issues that kept him in the hospital for much of the first year and a half of the pandemic. Finally, on February 24, 2022, Jon died of lymphoma. And on February 28, the other four of us watched on Zoom as Cathy and the gathered family and congregation celebrated Jon's life and remembered the promise of the resurrection. From a distance, we sent all the love and prayer we could muster for our friend Cathy in her time of deep loss.

Shortly after the funeral, Cathy developed COVID twice, suffered from a detached retina, and it just seemed that she would never get through the challenges of health, life, and grief. Meanwhile, another group member lost both of her brothers to cancer within six months of each other. Grief came to roost in her body for quite some time. All of this sparked renewed grief in third group member whose sister had died unexpectedly 5 years ago and her mother 3 years ago. We, in the midst of busy lives and grieving during the late spring and summer of 2023, failed to meet for a couple of months and little did we know what a wake-up call we would get.

On September 10th, Cathy wasn't making sense while leading worship and people took her to the hospital. By Monday they had performed brain surgery. On Tuesday, Cathy awoke and by Wednesday, she could talk fairly well. On Thursday, we got our wake-up call that our friend was seriously ill. By October 12th, she reached out to us to tell us that she was ready to Zoom again and that her tumor was a malignant glioblastoma. Two weeks later, the miracles of Zoom connected Buffalo, NY; Colton, NY; Charleston, IL; Farmington, IL; and Noblesville, IN. And we have learned the

lesson that we are NEVER too busy to meet with one another, listen to one another, and love on one another.

We are working hard to bring hope, peace, joy, and love into the midst of lives filled with grief and pain. This is the real light of Christ – the light of love for one another in dark times. This is the real meaning of celebrating the birth of Christ as we go through our lives, especially as we age. With the birth of a child comes the promise of death to this life and the gift of eternal life. May we all remember this Advent and Christmas season to make the time for those in dark places, for those whom we love, for those who are far away, and for those who are near. Reach out to your neighbors, strangers, those who are estranged, and those you miss. May the promises of Christ be born again this day, this month, this year.
