As I look over our last year together, I realize how many great things are going on in this congregation! Here are a few.

- 1. We are very welcoming to families with children. I have NEVER seen anyone glare at a baby or a child making noise NEVER. That's almost unheard of in churches! This congregation truly delights in the gifts of children and youth. I'm surprised there hasn't been more tussles over holding babies.
- 2. We are gifted with talented musicians singers and accompanists. We must remember that keeping that talent at such a high level requires practice, practice, practice. There is a dedication and a sacrifice of time and energy that we may not fully appreciate. Remember to thank our musicians! And thank them for mentoring our young people who are singing in the choir. (More evidence of Item 1.)
- 3. We love working together especially when food is involved. It took me a year to fully appreciate how deeply true this is. There is food at almost every single week during Fellowship time; Soup Supper fundraisers; the Fourth of July food booth; dinner and snacks each night during Vacation Bible School; meals after funerals... Hospitality is a mandate in the Bible. Jesus depended on the hospitality of others as he traveled and ministered. Many of Jesus' teachings were presented while at table with others (very prevalent in Luke's gospel).
- 4. An overwhelming percentage of the people present on any given Sunday give of their time and talent in service to the church or community. From mowing the yards, to filling up the Little Food Pantry, to teaching Sunday School, to organizing the kitchen, to providing lunch and snacks to the confirmands (Move evidence of Item 3), to changing the outdoor sign weekly, to serving on the Session/Deacons/Trustees, to volunteering to be a Financial Secretary/Treasurer/Church Secretary/Clerk of Session. And the list goes on WHEW! THANK YOU!
- 5. People are willing to risk trying new things! This is exceptional. Many people are afraid of failure and so they won't try. For instance, Jodi has started the Feed the Faith program. Alissa (with the help of others) has started a Junior/Senior High Youth Group. A Men's Bible Study group gave it a good try. *What would you like to try in 2024?*
